

FIXING A GREEN POOL

MAKING POOL CARE SIMPLE ALL YEAR ROUND

CAUTION:

Please remember that whenever you use pool chemicals you must read and follow the safety precautions on the label. Some of our products can be very harmful on the skin, in your eyes, or your mouth and lungs. You should keep all of them out of the reach of children, and never mix the chemicals together unless specifically instructed to do so.

Usually a pool is green because it has not been getting enough free chlorine and algae has grown in the pool. Often this is the state of the pool at the end of winter.

To fix it

- 1) turn on your filter
- 2) brush the sides and floor if required to loosen any algae
- 3) balance the water (pH at least must be close to neutral at 7.2 7.8 for other chemicals to work well)
- 4) shock dose with Chlorine Granules, or Dichlor Granules
- 5) add Clean the Green algaecide

The filter may need backwashing after this process.

Often the pool is no longer green but it is left cloudy by fine particles of dead algae in the water.

THE CLOUDY POOL

Make sure that your filter is working properly and is being used long enough each day.

If it is then the cloudiness is usually caused by particles too small for your filter to pick up.

If you cannot see the bottom use Splash Liqua Floc, if it is only slightly cloudy then you can use Sparkle Cubes. In each case follow the instructions on the product labels.
